

REPORT OF ACTIVITIES ORGANIZED ON THE OCCASION OF INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY, 2026

Introduction

As part of the celebration of International Women's Day, the environmental education center organized a series of activities aimed at promoting women's empowerment, the sharing of experiences, and the recognition of female talents. These activities took place on Thursday, March 5, Saturday, March 7, and Sunday, March 8, 2026, and brought together participants from the local community, female learners, as well as the center's facilitators. These activities aimed to: Strengthen women's capacities through learning income-generating activities, raise awareness about the role of women in environmental protection and community development, encourage the exchange of experiences among women, and promote creativity and female talents.

1- Training on Beaded Bag Making (March 5, 2026)

On March 5, 2026, a practical training session on beaded bag making was organized at the center. This training focused on: the presentation of the materials used (beads, threads, needles, closures, fabric, etc.), the basic techniques of bead assembly, the design and progressive creation of a beaded bag. At the end of this training, the participants acquired basic skills in making beaded bags. Several participants succeeded in creating their first bead attachment bases. The activity generated a lot of interest as it can be a source of income-generating activity.



2- Talk Between Women

On March 7, 2026, a round table was organized around the theme of International Women's Day and awareness related to the role of women in environmental protection; the path to follow to legalize its trade concerning forest products and a reminder of the new 2024 law and its various sanctions. This meeting allowed: exchanges of experiences between participants, discussions on the challenges women face in their community, raising awareness about the importance of women's participation in environmental initiatives.



3- March 8 Parade

On March 8, 2026, the women of the village and those of the CBPP staff took part in a commemorative parade marking International Women's Day. The participants paraded in a festive atmosphere, dressed in their commemorative wraps with the banner of the environmental education center. The event took place in friendliness and joy.



Conclusion

In summary, the activities organized from March 5 to 8, 2026, as part of International Women's Day were a success. They helped to strengthen women's skills, promote exchanges, and highlight their role in society and in environmental protection. It would be desirable to make this type of activity permanent in order to continue supporting the empowerment of women within the community, and the park will have a smaller human footprint.
